
Next, plan to join the field trips

February 17

The Great Backyard Bird Count <u>*gbbc.birdcount.org/*</u> will occur for the third year in the area to the east of the Las Cruces Dam starting at Sage Crest Park (Roadrunner Parkway and Frontier Drive). Meet at the park at 6:45 .am. for a morning of birding and walking.

March 24

See why **Sandhill Arroyo/North Las Cruces Park** is a premier local birding area. Meet at 7:30 a.m. at our fearless guide's home, 4186 Seneca Drive, Las Cruces, to start walking the arroyo. Public facilities and beverages are availabe. The morning includes an easy walk in the sand and on some road surfaces.



<u>April 21</u>

Mark this date for a visit to Percha Dam State Park, one of New Mexico's better birding spots, 45 minutes from Las Cruces on I-25. The group will leave at 7:15 a.m. from the old K-Mart parking lot (end closest to the Chevron Station) off US 70. Bring a NM State Parks day pass if you have one. Carpooling will be available. Some of the wildlife highlights observed at Percha are mountain lion, Osprey, Great Kiskadee, Vermillion Flycatcher and Eastern Phoebe. MVAS Teams identify 132 species during Christmas Bird Count

The Mesilla Valley Audubon Society (MVAS) 43rd Las Cruces Christmas Bird Count (CBC). 13 teams of birders (a total of 48 field observers) covered the Las Cruces CBC circle from sunrise to sunset. The weather was perfect for birding with lots of sunshine and no rain nor wind (unlike the previous year's CBC!).

The total bird count was 32,259 which is average for our CBC (last year was 19,959). The total species

count was 132 which is second only to 1996's species total of 139 (last year was 101).

Eight unusual or rare birds identified included Hairy Woodpecker, Downy Woodpecker, Turkey Vulture, Broad-billed Hummingbird, Northern Rough-winged Swallow, Cave Swallow, Pygmy Nuthatch, and Blackthroated Gray Warbler.

The White-winged Dove count was down 1,273 to 6,205; the American Crow count was up 3,822 to 7,951. Surprisingly, we had a Eurasian-collared Dove
