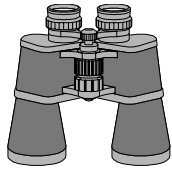

Field Trips

Field trips are free and open to the general public. Entry fees to some areas may be required and driving costs are shared. On all field trips wear appropriate clothing and bring water, sunscreen, and binoculars. Announced trips subject to change—to receive updates and reminders, sign up for the field trip email list, by contacting Mark Pendleton at mpndltn@gmail.com (put *MVAS Field Trips* in the subject line).

Percha Dam State Park. May 17. Meet at 06:00 hrs in the SW corner (closest to the Border Patrol Station) of the parking lot at Lowe's Home Improvement on N. Main to leave at 06:15 hrs. You can arrange carpooling in advance with your favorite riders/drivers, or we can do it on the spot. In addition to binoculars and field guide, plan to bring lots of water, sunscreen, and maybe bug repellent. A wide-brimmed hat and light comfortable walking shoes are also highly advisable. PDSP is one of the better birding spots in the state and such species as Vermilion Flycatcher; Common Black-Hawk; many ducks and warblers; both yellowlegs; Phainopepla; Eastern, Black and Say's Phoebes; plus many more are good possibilities. Reality Check: Chapter Fundraising & Membership Options

Last month our annual Teacher Award recognized two local K-12 teachers who are actively engaging their students in projects that help them learn about and care for the natural award. This month we announce the winner of our scholarship that supports conservation research at NMSU (see p. 2). How do we fund such projects? We rely on your generosity. Annual Scholarship Awarded

The MVAS scholarship committee is pleased to announce the winner of this year's Richard Bischoff Memorial Scholarship, which helps support the conservation-related research of a graduate student at New Mexico State University. This year's winner is DeeAnne Meliopoulos, a student the the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Conservation Ecology.

DeeAnne is studying the impacts of a new solar energy facility on breeding birds in the Nutt Grasslands west of Hatch. She will be monitoring bird abundance and diversity at varying distances from the facility, as well as assessing the facility's impact on noise levels, predation rates, and the breeding success of Horned Larks and Western Meadowlarks. Join us in congratulating DeeAnne at our annual potluck on May 21st when we'll award her the scholarship.
